BUDDING young dancers have been learning smooth new moves at a summer school at Lutterworth Performing Arts Centre in recent weeks.

The centre, based in Hall Lane, has a number of workshops in the coming weeks aimed at improving youngsters' dance and acting skills.

Bradley Woodward, principal of the centre, said: "There are still three weeks of summer activities to come.

"All the courses are designed to learn

or develop skills in a safe environment. Children can be dropped off early and picked up late if parents need to.

"Each course is designed as a creative outlet so that each child, irrespective of their ability, will increase in self-confidence, self-esteem, make friends and have a heap of fun."

Next week's course, beginning on Monday and called Acting Up, is an acting workshop aimed at children aged from seven to 16, with a production on

the Friday.

A street dance workshop aimed at the same age group is being held on the week commencing August 15, and a Glee workshop will be held on the week commencing August 22.

These also have a production on the Fridays at the end of the week.
