NNB Allow extra time to queue for tickets in summer time, especially at Waterloo and Victoria where many seaside train journeys begin.

Sunday 7<sup>th</sup> June (Landranger Map 153) Leader: Robert Slater

MEET: Kings Cross main line station 1100 for 1122 train to Biggleswade (arr 1201)

LUNCH: The New Inn, Biggleswade town centre. Meals very reasonably priced.

TEA: Biggleswade. The Crown Inn or open air café, depending on time back and weather.

DISTANCE: 7 miles, returning from Biggleswade. Walk begins after lunch to visit RSPB headquarters and Nature Reserve (Sandy) comprising woodland, heathland, gardens and shop (coffee / tea from machine). Hoping for trauma-free day after last year's unexpected power failure on railway.

FARE: £10.90 cdr Biggleswade from Kings Cross, £6.60 from Zone 6 boundary, both with Network card

Robert will meet the ramblers at Biggleswade.

**Sunday 14<sup>th</sup> June** (Landranger Map 166) Leader: Martin Harrison

MEET: Liverpool Street 1000 for 1022 train to Turkey Street (arr 1045)

LUNCH: Bring a packed lunch, or eat at a garden centre. Drinks at the Fallow Buck Public House, Enfield.

TEA: Trent Country Park, Cockfosters.

DISTANCE: 10 miles, returning from Cockfosters Underground Station (Piccadilly Line, Zone 5)

FARE: £7.20 all zone Travelcard, or Freedom Pass.

Martin will meet the ramblers at Turkey Street.

Sunday 21st June (Explorer Map 174\*) Leaders: Virginia and Roger Yelland

MEET: Loughton Station at 1000. Loughton is in Zone 6, on the Underground Central Line, about 45 minutes from Oxford Circus.

LUNCH: The Owl, Lippitt's Hill, with fine view, bar food and McMullens ales.

TEA: The Robin Hood Tea Hut, for an excellent bacon roll and / or a variety of cakes.

DISTANCE: 11 miles through Epping Forest, returning from Loughton.

FARE: Travelcard to include Zone 6, or Freedom Pass.

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Saturday 27<sup>th</sup> June (Landranger Map 179) Leader: Chris McNicholas

MEET: Victoria 0910 for 0936 train to Dover Priory (arr 1150 – bus service from Shepherd's Well)

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LUNCH: The Coastguard, St Margarets-at-Cliffe Village

TEA: The Zetland Arms, Kingsdown (the pub is on the beach)

DISTANCE: 14 miles, returning from Deal (undulating, scenic coast path)

FARE: £16.85 cdr Deal from Victoria, £13.75 from Zone 6 boundary, both with Network Card. If you are also doing the walk on 28<sup>th</sup> June, you will need an off-peak return to Deal, £19.55 from Victoria, £18.90 from Zone 6 boundary (with Network Card)..

If you are staying over, you will need to book B&B. Contact Chris on 07717 220163 or the Deal Visitor Centre on 01304 369576.

At St Margarets you can visit botanical gardens, the village, the beach, and there may be an opportunity for a swim, so bring a towel and costume.

**Sunday 28<sup>th</sup> June** (Landranger Map 179) Leader: as for 27<sup>th</sup> June

MEET: Victoria 0740 for 0803 train to Deal (arr 1030 – change trains at Ramsgate). Chris will meet ramblers at Deal. There is an 1100 Mass at Deal.

LUNCH: The Port Arms, Deal (sea front)

TEA: The Chequers Restaurant and Bar (arriving there before 4 pm)

DISTANCE: 13 miles, returning from Deal (flat, open coastal route).

FARE: £16.85 cdr Deal from Victoria, £13.75 from Zone 6 boundary, both with Network Card.

Visits include Sholden Village, Mary Bax's Stone, Sandwich Bay and beach – opportunity for a swim, so bring towel and costume.

DISTANCE: 12 miles, returning from Eastbourne.

FARE: £13.85 cdr Eastbourne from Victoria, £12.60 from Zone 6 boundary, both with Network Card

MEET: Euston Main Line Station at 0905 for 0923 train to Berkhamsted (arr 0958)

LUNCH: Martin's Pond, Potten End (GR 018 089). Pub does food and overlooks the Village Green, where there is a pond and seats for those with their own food.

HA revival: From the magazine of the Ramblers Association to which we are affiliated we have gleaned some good news about the Youth Hostel Association. Those of us who have used YHA hostels in the past were saddened by the number of closures due the financial problems in the early years of this decade. However we are now glad to have news of NEW HOSTELS opening up this year. A new 30-bed self-catering hostel opened on 1 May at the eastern end of the South downs Way, about a mile and a half from the centre of Eastbourne. The new building, constructed of locally-sourced building materials and with a living sedum roof, is all on one level and all bedrooms are en suite. It replaces the former hostel which was sadly destroyed in an arson attack in 2004.

Towards the end of the summer another new YHA hostel is expected to open at Southease, near Lewes, and also on the South Downs Way.

These new hostels will bring the number in the South East to nearly 20. Full details on the YHA website www.yha.org.uk.


aturday 10<sup>th</sup> October: Annual General Meeting and Mass for Members' Intentions
