



# WINTERTON ON SEA PARISH COUNCIL NEWSLETTER - APRIL 2010



The **Parish Council meeting** was held on **Thursday 15 April** in the Church Room and twelve residents were welcomed to the meeting.

**Public discussion** – concerns were raised about the potholes in the road surface on the “S bend” by Mill Farm. These are going to be repaired and the banks that have slipped will be cut back soon by NCC Highways who will be completing the work.

**Borough Cllr** Weymouth reported that GYBC are prosecuting two people for letting their dogs foul.

The **PCSO** reported nine crimes this month; 5 domestics, a person left a guest house without paying and three criminal damages.

The following Planning Applications and Planning decisions were reviewed:

**Planning Applications:**

**06/10/0193F** – Proposed single storey side extension at Spring Cottage, Bush Road. Winterton Parish Council had no objections.

**06/10/0197/F** – Addition of a conservatory to rear of previously approved detached bungalow (06/08/000/F) at Seaview (adjacent) Bush Road. Winterton Parish Council had no objections.

**Planning Decisions:**

**06/10/0053/F** – Proposed replacement dwelling at 47 Long Beach Estate. GYBC Refused.

**06/10/0035/F** – Provision of externally sited air source heat pumps to each of the seven dwellings previously approved under Application Nos 06/02/0606/F and 06/05/0868/F at the former Hales House site in King Street. GYBC Refused.

**06/10/0018/F** – New brick wall to road frontage, installation of oil tanks. Reinstatement of grass verge, amend siting of garage unit to NW Corner at former Thermaglow site, North Market Road. GYBC Approved.

**Updates on Councillors responsibilities** were given.

Community Fundraising Officer, Elizabeth Wright, says, “The Fish and Chip Supper is a wonderful opportunity for a great evening with friends and family. We are also encouraging people who work to hold a Fish and Chip Lunch in their work places to raise even more funds. You may be even a local community group wanting to run a fun evening with your group. Be a part of something special and make a real difference to help spinal cord injured people gain access to the information and support they need to enable them to live full and independent lives.”
