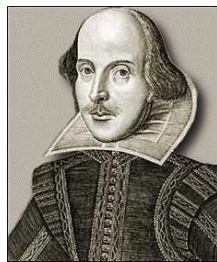

Donations in lieu of presents raised over £738 towards the repair of the church heating fund.

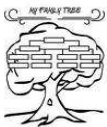


Householders are reminded to be cautious of cold callers to their homes following a distraction burglary in Winterton-on-sea. A man visited a property to purchase jewellery from the elderly occupant after distributing flyers. Despite being asked to remain outside, the man entered the property and left having purchased some items. It was later discovered that he had stolen other property. Householders are urged to always lock front and back doors and use spy holes, door chains or simply speak through the door to any cold callers. Genuine callers will have identification and this should be verified by calling their organisation. Contact police on 999 if you are suspicious or see anyone calling on homes in your neighbourhood and think they are not genuine.

Keyholder scheme to give peace of mind

An initiative to ensure peace of mind to both business and home owners has been re-launched by Norfolk Constabulary. Norfolk Keyholder is a database of nominated individuals, including the owner, who can be contacted if an alarm sounds or an incident develops at the premises. The scheme saves time and inconvenience as it enables the building to be secured avoiding further loss, cost or injury. It requires the property owner to nominate themselves and four additional keyholders who would be able to access the property in an emergency. If an incident occurs at the resident's property and the resident is away, one of the other keyholders will be contacted by a police officer. If suspicious activity is reported at the location an officer will also be requested to attend. The system will be administered by staff in the Constabulary Contact and Control Room, with all the personal data held securely in accordance with national data quality principles and standards. For non commercial properties the cost is £13/annum, while for commercial premises the cost is £25/annum.

Winterton on Sea Parish Council

Nine residents were welcomed to the Parish Council meeting which took place on Thursday 16th June 2011 in the Church Rooms.

1. Public discussion:

- No issues raised.

2. To receive a report from the County/Borough Councillors:

- Cllr Weymouth noted that, with regard to the comment made in the May minutes regarding the uncertainty of the Code of Conduct Committee, NCC was considering forming its own Committee.
- Grass cutting had been suspended by GYBC due to the weather and the Council was offering to carry out other tasks instead.

•

3. To consider planning Applications and review planning permissions: -

- **06/11/0315/F. Proposed sub-division of garden to form single plot and construction of detached bungalow. Sunny View, Winterton.** It was recommended that the application be rejected for the following reasons: neighbouring properties overlooked; subdivision of garden and building in a garden; close to boundary; the development would not enhance or contribute anything to village. **The Council agreed to reject this application.**
- **06/11/0288/F. Retrospective application for child's play fort. 7 James Gray Close, Winterton.** It was recommended that the application be rejected for the following reasons: structure is too tall (4 metres); one neighbour had objected. **The Council agreed to reject this application.**
- **06/11/0317/F. Proposed alteration, extension and roof conversion of existing detached bungalow. Red Cliff, Bush Road, Winterton.** It was recommended that the application be rejected for the following reasons: loss of privacy and light to neighbouring properties; over-development of site; not in keeping with existing dwellings and character of area; 5 letters of objection from neighbours had been received. **The Council agreed to reject this application**
- **06/11/0320/F. Retrospective Application to Retain Chiller Units, Loomes Stores, Market Place, Winterton.** **The Parish Council agreed to approve this application subject to the chillers being enclosed.**

Planning Decisions

- **06/11/0155/F.** Alterations and extension at rear to form kitchen/diner with mono-pitched roof. 2 May Cottages, Back Road. **GYBC Approved.**
- **06/11/0157/F.** Single storey extension to front, two-storey extension to rear, erection of garage and oil tank enclosure. 13 Council House, Somerton Road. **GYBC Refused**

An update on what's happening at Age Concern Great Yarmouth

First allow me to introduce myself. My name is Jackie Tierney, I am the Older Peoples Development Worker with Age Concern. Our mission statement is.... *'Age Concern Great Yarmouth works for the well-being of older people throughout the borough of Great Yarmouth to help make life a more fulfilling and enjoyable experience'*. How do we try to do this?

We have over 65 clubs and groups affiliated to Age Concern Great Yarmouth, with a membership of up to 3000 older people. Since I started in October 2010, I have visited many of them and I find as I go round people are not too sure of just what we do, so I thought this would be an opportunity to let more people know.

We publish a quarterly **Newsletter**, which goes out to all the clubs and groups. Our aim is to keep people better informed of local events, new services starting, Club News, useful information and contacts etc. We also invite individual membership for £3.00 a year, for those who do not belong to a club or group and would like a copy of the Newsletter. Our weekly **Pop In** takes place at the Priory every Wednesday from 10 am – 12 noon. This is an opportunity to come and have a tea/coffee with a biscuit for 50pence. It can be a time to catch up with friends or meet some new people in an informal and friendly setting. We also have two **Lunch Clubs**, Tuesday at The Green Gate Caister and Thursday at The Turnstone, Hopton. Both Clubs start at 12 with a two course lunch for £5.00, followed by, a raffle, quiz, hoi, a game of play your cards right and more. Staff and volunteers are also on hand to offer support and information. How **Help, Information and Support Service** runs from the Age UK Charity shop at the top of Kings Street, Great Yarmouth. The service is open on Wed, Thurs, and Fridays from 10 am – 2pm with Tuesdays being for Insurance enquiries. Our aim is to provide clear, accurate, local, up to date information, to inform and empower people in later life, to find services they need to maintain their independence and health. Our **Open Meetings** take place in the spring and autumn; these are to keep older people better informed on topics such as health and financial matters. Plus for all our affiliated groups, clubs and individual members we have our **Annual Reunion and Turkey and Tinsel**. These are times for members to come together, for a fun filled day of good food, good music, great entertainment and excellent company. Most recently we are proud to announce the start of our **Befriending Service**. The service is designed to benefit older people, who are often socially isolated. Our volunteers are able to offer regular contact, create trust and friendship. All too often older people are wary of professional services, afraid of losing control. The befriender, as well as providing social contact, can also act as a link, to a wide range of information, services and additional support.

Where would we be without our dedicated and wonderful team of **volunteers**? Volunteers are essential to our work and support a wide range of our services. Volunteers can make a real difference to an older person. In return we provide our volunteers with appropriate training for their role, out of pocket expenses, an opportunity to meet new people, learn new skills and on-going support.
