WINTERTON ON SEA PARISH COUNCIL - THURSDAY 17 FEBRUARY 2011

Five residents were welcomed to the Parish Council meeting which took place in the Village Hall.

Public Discussion:

- A resident requested a long handled litter picker so that she could pick up litter on the recreation ground. It was agreed that this would be provided and the Council thanked her for offering to keep the recreation ground free of rubbish.
- A resident also noted that many volunteers help run events and committees in the village and a list should be made up to demonstrate that Winterton is already participating in the "Big Society" and sent to the PM and our local MP.
- A resident made the following comments regarding the drainage works on Winmer Avenue:
 - The work should have commenced last summer and had it done so, there would have been enough money allocated to the project to do the whole of Winmer Avenue. The resident believed that the full extent of the flood problem had not been made clear to the engineers but it was noted that this would have been the responsibility of Highways Department and not the Parish Council.
 - It was noted by Cllr Blake that the project had now been allocated £60k but this was only enough to do half way up Winmer Avenue. If this did not solve the problem then additional money would have to be applied for.
- The dog fouling problem was raised again and Cllr Blake reiterated that, **based on firm** evidence, offenders would be prosecuted and that no other action would be taken by the Parish Council.

The Broads Authority are planning the first Broads Festival of the Outdoors from 7th -15 May

Fishermans Return <u>Quiz Night</u> Thursday 24 March 8 pm Teams of 4

IT'S PANCAKE DAY - TUESDAY 8TH MARCH - Perfect Pancake Recipe



110g/4oz plain flour, sifted Pinch of salt 2 eggs 200ml/7 fl oz milk mixed with 75ml/3 fl oz water

- 50g/2 oz butter
- 1. Sift flour and salt into a large mixing bowl. Make a well in the centre of the flour and break the eggs into it. Whisk in the eggs incorporating flour from around the edge of the bowl as you do so.
- 2. Gradually add small quantities of the milk and water mixture, still whisking until the batter is smooth, with the consistency of thin cream. Melt the butter in a pan. Spoon 2 tbsp of it into the batter and whisk it in.
- 3. Pour the rest of the melted butter into your frying pan and get the pan hot. Pour in ladlefull of batter mixture and as soon as the batter hits the hot pan, tip it around from side to side to get the base evenly coated with batter. It should take only half a minute or so to cook. Lift the edge with a palette knife to see if it's cooked. Flip the pancake over with a pan slice or palette knife - the other side will need a few seconds only - then slide onto a plate.
- 4. If you plan to make lots of pancakes, stack them as you make them between sheets of greaseproof paper on a plate fitted over simmering water to keep them warm.
- 5. To serve, sprinkle each pancake with freshly squeezed lemon juice and caster sugar, fold in half, then in half again to form triangles, or else simply roll them up. Serve sprinkled with a little more sugar and lemon juice and extra sections of lemon.

People have asked about an Oil Syndicate in Winterton but, unfortunately, nobody seems willing to set up and run one. Hopefully, this Winter is drawing to an end – but what about next year? Prices seem only to be going up - is anyone willing to organise a syndicate?
