Policing update for the Caister and Coastal neighbourhood


Police are urging shoppers to be vigilant after two distraction incidents in car parks in Norfolk on Thursday 13th June.

In the *Morrison's* car park at Riverside in Norwich, at around 12.35pm police received reports of people acting suspiciously around parked cars. One man spoke to a woman in a car, asking for directions to Dover, holding a map. A 2nd man took her handbag from the passenger side but she was able to take her bag back, the man then walked off. A woman was also asking for money at her car door. Another similar incident, in a *Tesco* car park in Dereham also occurred.

The men are described as in their late 30s, one was wearing a dark grey coat

and the other a dark bomber jacket. The woman is described as in her early 20s with long dark hair and was wearing a black top. The man with the map is described as white, 5 foot 6 inches tall, of stocky build with dark wavy hair and stubble, wearing a dark bomber jacket. He spoke with a foreign accent. Shoppers are advised to ensure that their vehicles and bags are secure at all times. **If someone asks you for help and you are uncomfortable politely decline and walk away.**

Six residents were welcomed to the Parish Council Meeting held on Thursday 20th June 2013 together with Cllrs Weymouth and Childs.

1. Public discussion:

- A resident reported that BT was not carrying out any phone connections at the moment because apparently the relay station contained asbestos. Clerk to follow up.
- Owners of certain potholed sections of Bush Road (private road) had received letters from Norfolk County Council reminding them of their responsibility to repair the surface to ensure the safety of users of the public footpath. NCC would give advice on what materials should be used etc.
- A resident expressed concern about the potential release of asbestos into the air if the farm buildings on Bulmer Lane were not demolished by a properly licensed company (see Planning Application **06/13/0266/F** below). Cllr Weymouth also agreed to contact the Planning Department.
- **To receive a report from the County/Borough Councillors**
 - Cllr Weymouth noted that a meeting was scheduled with the Ambulance Service.
 - Cllr Childs noted the following:
 - Winterton School needed a new governor;
 - The British Heart Foundation is setting up a "Healthy Lives" project in Great Yarmouth to help people with learning disabilities. Details will be published in the August newsletter;
 - NCC Highways had asked the Council's views on the yellow lining of Beach Road outside the Methodist Church and extending round into The Lane. The Clerk would let Cllr Childs know their views before the 26th July, the deadline for comments.

2. To consider planning applications and review planning permissions: -

Applications:

Harmony Patch - revised drawings. **A response had already been given to the**

Planning Department that the Parish Council's objections remained the same.

06/13/0219/F Conversion of outbuilding to one bedroom holiday accommodation - Mill Farm. **A response had already been given to the Planning Department that the Parish Council had no objections.**

06/13/0226/F Proposed residential development of site to comprise 2 bungalows and 2 chalet style bungalows - Bulmer Lane. **The Parish Council had no objections but with the condition that the possibility of asbestos in the existing farm buildings be investigated and, if present, that the demolition of the buildings be carried out by a properly licensed company.**

06/13/0270/F Proposed new access - Church Farm Cottages. **No objections**

Decisions: 06/13/0093/F Repowering of Blood Hills Wind Farm. Removal of 10 turbines and replacing with 2. **GYBC approved.**

06/13/0219/F Conversion of outbuilding to one bedroom holiday accommodation - Mill Farm. **GYBC approved.**

Rector's Ramblings

Well the sky is grey, the clouds are gathering speed and foreboding, plants are being tested by the strong breeze and I wish summer would arrive...or even maybe, Spring; but enough of the moaning. At the time of writing I am recovering from my first operation and awaiting a date to have the second procedure carried out. Once again I have been deeply humbled by your prayers and kind wishes for a speedy recovery – THANK YOU.

During this period of recuperation I have been visited by Revd Val Gagen and her husband Philip. I was Val's Training Incumbent in the North Hinckford Team before I joined the Flegg Coastal Benefice. A very pastoral lady, Val is also a Clown having been inspired to do some Holy Fooling by the Revd Roly Bain, Chaplain to the Clowns. She met Roly at a Diocese of Chelmsford conference at Caister! In her article "The Curate Cogitates..." written for the July magazine in North Essex, Val poses her team of churches 5 questions gleaned from a recent training day she attended. I would like to pose those same questions to the churches here in Hemsby, West Somerton, Horsey and Winterton:

1. If discipleship is a journey, what implications does that have for the way we do church? How can we ensure that our churches are not static gatherings of the faithful but rather communities of people on the move?
2. Church is what happens when people encounter the Risen Jesus and commit

themselves to sustaining and deepening that encounter in their encounter with each other. [Rowan Williams] How can we help people who are not attracted by church to encounter the Risen Jesus?

3. Think about your church. How good are the relationships? Is the church a genuine community of people who love one another? How can you help people to encounter Jesus through their encounter with each other?

4. How would the members of your church define its purpose? Is that the way you would like them to define it?

5. Think about your church. If you were to start again from scratch, would you do things the same way? If not, how would you change them? Why aren't you changing them now? These are all important questions if, as Christian folk we are to be explorers and not just map makers.

I very much look forward to being back with you all as soon as possible. In the meantime please do support and encourage those taking services and generally keeping our beautiful churches open.
