Our Priority is You

A NEW WAY TO CONTACT YOUR POLICE

Norfolk Constabulary has introduced a new telephone number covering non-urgent issues. Instead of 0845 456 4567, **you should now dial 101**. All Police Forces will adopt 101 by year-end and you will be able to contact the local police non-emergency service, wherever you are in England and Wales. 101 will be available 24 hours a day, seven days a week. The system determines your location and connects to the police force covering the area. A recorded message announces which force you are being connected to – and gives a choice if on a boundary between two or more forces. Police call handlers in the local force contact centre will answer the call and respond appropriately. There is also an option of speaking to an operator, if the caller wishes to contact another force. Calls from landlines and mobile networks cost 15 pence per call, no matter what time of day or the duration of the call. People who are deaf, hard of hearing or speech impaired can textphone 18001 101.

Hospital Transport – new phone number

People who need help to travel to hospital appointments using the non-emergency patient transport service will now need to use the new phone number – **01493 45377**. This is for people who have a medical condition meaning they are unable to travel to their appointment in any other way. Various vehicles are used to provide the service, along with trained staff to offer support throughout the journey. Anyone ringing the service will be assessed for their suitability and should have details of their appointment, hospital number, NHS number and GP address to hand when they call. The service should be booked two weeks in advance and is available for appointments at our local hospitals – James Paget, N&N, Mental Health & Community Care Clinics.

Winterton on Sea Parish Council

Five residents were welcomed to the Parish Council meeting which took place on Thursday 20th October 2011 in the Village Hall.

1. **Public discussion:**
 - Nothing to report
2. **To Receive a report from Borough/County Councillors**
 - None present. Apologies were received from Cllr Weymouth.
3. **To receive a report from the PCSO:**
 - Cllr Blake reported that 15 calls for assistance had been received in the month: 1 crime (burglary of a dwelling) and 3 anti-social behaviour.
 - Cllr Blake also reminded everyone that the new non-emergency number was 101, which replaced the old 0845 number.

4. **To consider planning Applications and review planning permissions:**

Applications:

- **06/11/0542/O.** Construction of detached three bedroom dwelling. Bush Road. No objections.
- **06/11/0598/F.** One and two storey extension and conversion of existing bungalow to create a family eco house. Pebble Lodge, The Craft. This was rejected for the following reasons: out of character with the neighbouring environment; impact on surrounding neighbours; incorrect information on report; over development of site; failed to meet Planning Policies HOU18 and BNV18. The vote was as follows: 7 rejections, 1 approval and 1 abstention.
- **06/11/0616/F.** Extension to North Elevation. 4J Bungalow, Low Road. No objections.

- **06/11/0515/F.** Retrospective application for child's play fort. 7 James Gray Close. **GYBC Approved.**
- **06/11/0500/F.** Single storey rear extension. 12 Long Beach Estate. **GYBC Approved.**

DIGITAL TV SWITCHOVER IS COMING!

In the early hours of 9th November the analogue BBC 2 signal will be switched off, followed by all remaining analogue channels on 23 November to be replaced by a digital service. If you do not have satellite or cable TV you will need to convert your existing TV to digital using a "digi box" (e.g. Freeview, BT Vision, TopUp TV) or buy a new TV with digital built in. If you have a "digi" box, you will need to re-tune all TVs or boxes in your home on 9th and 23rd November at both stages of the switchover. To re-tune a Freeview TV or box, switch on and press "menu" on your remote control, select "set-up" or "installation", select "full re-tune" (or "first-time installation, "factory re-set" or "default settings"). Press "OK" if your equipment asks if you want to delete all your channels – this is normal. If you are prompted for a code, try 0000 or 1234 and the new channels will automatically be installed. This may take a few minutes and your equipment may shut down and re-start. There is a **Help Scheme** for those aged 75 or over or who have lived in a Care Home for 6 months or more, or is eligible for attendance allowance, mobility supplement or disability allowance or is registered blind or partially sighted. All those who are eligible should have received an information pack and needs to reply. The Help Scheme includes easy to use equipment, an approved installer to supply and install the equipment for you with 12-month aftercare service, free helpline and help with re-tuning. This service costs £40 all-inclusive but is free for eligible people on certain income-related benefits.

If you have satellite or cable TV you will need to do nothing.

After switchover, if your VCR or DVD recorder is not digital, please be aware you will not be able to record one channel while you watch another – you will need a digital TV recorder to do this.

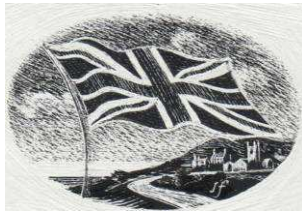

SWEET CHILLI BANGERS + CHEESY BEAN POTATOES

- | | |
|-------------------------|--|
| 6 large baking potatoes | 6 large spring onions, finely chopped |
| 85g butter | 175 g mature grated cheddar + 85g extra for sprinkling |
| 1 tbsp English mustard | 2 x 300g cans drained red kidney beans |

Oil and season the potatoes, then bake for 1 hr until a knife slides in easily and the skins are crispy. Cool for 10 mins. Halve the potatoes lengthways and scoop out the cooked potato into a bowl, leaving a thin layer behind so that the skins hold their shape. Mash the potato with the butter, mustard and seasoning, then stir in the spring onions, 175g cheese and kidney beans. Pile the mixture into the potato skins and scatter with the remaining cheese. Bake for 30-40 mins until golden.

| 12 large meaty pork sausages | 2 tsp mild chilli powder |
| 4 tbsp tomato ketchup | 2 crushed garlic cloves |
| 2 tbsp clear honey | Half teaspoon dried oregano |

Heat oven to 220C/fan 200C/gas 7. Arrange the sausages in a roasting tin in a single layer and bake for 10 mins. Meanwhile, mix together all the other ingredients with seasoning and 1 tbsp water. Pour the ketchup mixture over the sausages and mix well. Bake for 30 mins more until the sausages are golden.
