Winterton on Sea Parish Council

Two residents were welcomed to the Parish Council meeting which took place on Thursday 15th September 2011 in the Church Rooms.

1. **Public discussion:**
 - A resident commented on the refurbishment of the Ivan King sign and it was confirmed that a letter of thanks had been sent.
2. **To Receive a report from Borough/County Councillors**
 - None present. Apologies were received from Cllrs Weymouth and Shrimplin.
3. **To receive a report from the PCSO:**
 - PCSO Rowland reported that 18 calls for assistance had been received in the month: 2 crimes (one criminal damage and one burglary); 3 Anti-social behaviour.
 - It was noted that the previously reported incidents of anti-social behaviour including use of abusive language were continuing and PCSO Rowland reiterated the need to report all occurrences to the police immediately.
4. **To consider planning Applications and review planning permissions:**

Applications:

06/11/0515/F. Retrospective application for child's play fort. 7 James Gray Close. Cllr Blake noted that this application was the same as the last one and so the previous objections, i.e. structure was too tall (4 metres); one neighbour had objected, had already been sent to the Planning Department.

06/11/0578/F. Sunnyview, The Craft. 3rd application. Cllr Blake noted that this revised application showed that the building had been moved away from the boundary and had increased in size. It was noted that GYBC had previously rejected this application on the grounds that the development was unneighbourly and constituted subdivision of a garden. The Parish Council agreed, once more, to object to this application on the previously stated grounds, i.e. that neighbouring properties would be overlooked; subdivision of garden and building in a garden; the development would not enhance or contribute anything to village.

06/11/0417/F. Erection of single storey rear conservatory extension. 11 Marram Court, North Market Road. **GYBC Approved.**

Householders should keep doors and windows locked wherever possible.

Additional crime prevention advice includes:

- If you are replacing or fitting new doors and windows, get ones that are certified to British Standard BS7950 (windows) or PAS 24-1 (doors)
- Fit mortise locks (Kitemarked BS3621) to all front and back doors and locks to all downstairs windows or windows which are easy to reach remove.
- Fit and use window locks on all accessible windows – both upstairs and downstairs.
- Keep your house and car keys safe and away from doors and windows
- Fit a burglar alarm, but make sure it is installed by a company who is registered with SSAIB or NSI and is fitted to BS EN50131.
- Keep your garage and garden shed locked with proper security locks, and keep any tools secure, out of sight and property marked
- Trim back any plants or hedges that a burglar could hide behind
- Make sure you have up-to-date insurance.

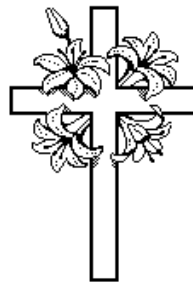
